



2020 Kris Schindel Award Announcement

Dr. Glennie is the President of J.L. Glennie Consulting Inc., providing a range of strategic advisory services to non-profit, government and industry clients. A senior member of the health care community, with over 25 years of experience in the national and international pharmaceutical policy world and a clinical pharmacist by background, Dr. Glennie has held roles in strategy, policy, teaching, research and patient care in the payer, regulator, industry, clinical and academic environments.



Dr. Glennie's public policy background includes a Master of Science in Community Health Science and lots of on-the-job training as the Associate Director, Drug Programs Branch, Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care; Manager and Director roles at Health Canada's Health Products and Foods Branch; and, a Federal Cabinet appointment to the Patented Medicine Prices Review Board. Prior to returning to the consulting world, Dr. Glennie was with Janssen Canada where she led HTA policy initiatives as well as post-marketing effectiveness research, strategic planning, reimbursement submissions and market access strategies.

Dr. Glennie served on the CAPT-ACTP Board of Directors as President and Past-President (2015-2017), and the Membership and Marketing Committee (2015-2016) where she developed the association membership strategy and social media policy. She also served as the Scientific Program Committee Co-Chair (2015-2016), producing the CAPT-ACTP Conference Planning Framework. Dr. Glennie also developed the CAPT-ACTP Ambassador Committee concept that was later operationalized by the governing Board of Directors.

From 2016 to 2018, Dr. Glennie provided leadership and guidance to CAPT-ACTP, serving as Chair of the Partnership Committee and Chair of the Nominations Committee. She also led preliminary discussions, environmental scanning, analysis, and job description development to support the hiring of an inaugural CAPT-ACTP Executive Director, as well as an update and overhaul of the CAPT-ACTP Bylaws. In recent years, Dr. Glennie was instrumental in supporting the Board of Directors and staff throughout the 2019 strategic planning process.
